- Scene 3 Evening, same day.
- Scene 4 Stable. The next morning.

PROPS - Book or scroll for Rabbi, pail and basket for Levi

SCENE 1

(AT RISE: It is the morning of the day before Jesus' birth. SONG: "THEN CAME JESUS" sung by the CHILDREN'S CHOIR.)

(As song ends RABBI YARVICH, carrying a book or scroll, enters and takes CS.)

RABBI: Shalom! Allow me to introduce myself. I am Rabbi Yarvich and Bethlehem is my home. Right now our little city is very busy. Caesar has decreed that all those born in Bethlehem should return to register and pay taxes. That Caesar! Now, I mean no disrespect, but the whole country is in confusion. It is my privilege to watch over our little town of Bethlehem. So, I walk through the streets and I pray. I read the Holy Book and I walk and I pray. I pray, "Oh, God, deliver your people, send the Messiah!"

(RABBI sits on a rock or bench to pray. As he is praying the CHILDREN enter, running and playing. When they notice the RABBI, they stop to give him respect.)

CHILDREN: Good morning, Rabbi Yarvich! How are you today?

RABBI: Good morning, children. I am quite well...enjoying the presence of the Lord.

(CHILDREN look around, questioningly.)

REUBEN: What are you reading, Rabbi?

RABBI: I am reading the prophets of old. Reuben, they have a great story to tell.

SETH: But their stories are all old.

RUTH: Excuse me, Rabbi Yarvich, but my father says the prophets of old have been dead for over 400 years. Do we not have any prophets alive today?

RABBI: I am afraid not, Ruth. God has not spoken to us in a very long time.

LEVI: Then why do we need to read and study the prophets? Why should we learn about men who lived such a long time ago?

RABBI: It is true, young Levi, the prophets did live a long time ago, but their message is still very important.

LEVI: What message...what could someone say who lived 400 years ago that I need to know today?

RABBI: Many things, my young friend, but none more important than the coming of the Messiah!

ANNA: The Messiah?

RABBI: Yes, Anna, the Messiah.

ALL: What do you mean? What Messiah? Is He really coming?

RUTH: My father believes the Messiah will come very soon and save us from our enemies.

LEVI: But they have believed that for many years and He has not come! Should we still believe? ALL: Yeah!

(As the CHILDREN run off, RABBI calls to LEVI, who returns.)

RABBI: Levi, could I have a word with you?

LEVI: Yes, what is it, Rabbi Yarvich? RABBI: How is your grandfather?

LEVI: He is well, thank you!

RABBI: I have not seen him in temple of late.

LEVI: I'm sure he means to come, but he is very busy. Since Mother and Father have died, he has me to care for and he has the inn to run!

RABBI: But to be too busy for God...it is not good!

LEVI: I am sure he is not too busy for God...but with so many people in Bethlehem because of taxes--

RABBI: (Interrupting) Yes, it is a busy time, that is true, but we must be careful that our hearts do not grow cold. Run along, now, with your friends...and tell your grandfather I asked of him.

LEVI: 'Bye...Shalom.

(SONG: "JEHOVAH" sung by the RABBI and the CHILDREN'S CHOIR.)

In the market place, in the still of the night. In the temple too, they seek your light.

(AT RISE: The next morning. LIGHTS come up on the CHILDREN playing.)

ABIGAIL: And they don't seem very happy.

ANNA: Paying taxes must not be very much fun.

LEVI: Grandfather says it is a curse!

REUBEN: I do not believe that I would want to give my money to Caesar.

MIRIAM: And I would not want to leave my home to do it.

ANNA: No wonder they are unhappy!

RUTH: Well, my father does not believe it is fair...but he says...

ALL: Yes...what does he say...tell us...please tell...

RUTH: Well, he says it is still a blessing. Because the people are spending lots of money. My father's bakery has never been so busy.

LEVI: My grandfather's inn is also very busy!

RUTH: In fact, Father says that we could also make some money.

SETH: Make some money, how?

ALL: Yeah, tell us! This I have to hear! I love money!

RUTH: Well, he said we should watch for opportunities to help the new people in town...you know, like carrying their bags, taking care of their animals...things like that! He said he is sure they would be happy to reward us.
