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**CAST OF CHARACTERS**

*(1 w, 4 children)*

**DORM MOM:** Middle-aged, runs the children's home.

**CHILD 1:** One of the orphans.

**CHILD 2:** Another.

**CHILD 3:** Another.

**CHILD 4:** Another.

**\*NOTE:** Although only four children are listed, directors may divide the lines among more children, if desired. An additional children's choir can be utilized. The songs can be sung as a group, solos or special numbers. You may substitute other songs in place of the ones suggested.)

## **THE TRACKS OF CHRISTMAS**

*(AT RISE: The great room of a children's home. Several CHILDREN are decorating a Christmas tree with the help of their DORM MOM. TWO CHILDREN enter from outside.)*

CHILD 1: *(Excited.)* There's a lot of snow out there. What a Christmas Eve!

CHILD 2: I saw some tracks in the snow. I don't know if it was a rabbit or what.

CHILD 3: I tossed out some scraps. Maybe an opossum came to eat them.

CHILD 4: Or maybe it was a coon.

DORM MOM: Tracks are interesting things. Why don't you all gather round and we will talk about the tracks of Christmas.

CHILD 2: The tracks of Christmas? What in the world is that?

DORM MOM: First, I'll read the Christmas story from the Bible. Then I'll explain about the tracks of Christmas.  
*(Opens HER Bible and reads Luke 2:1-5)*

**SONG: "O Little Town Of Bethlehem"**

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DORM MOM: Do you think there were any tracks made that first Christmas Eve?

CHILD 1: The animals probably made some tracks in the stable.

CHILD 3: Yes, cow tracks.

CHILD 4: And sheep.

CHILD 2: Donkeys.

CHILD 1: Chickens, maybe?

DORM MOM: Let's read on. (*Reads Luke 2:6,7*)

**SONG: "Away In A Manger"**

CHILD 2: The angels made tracks.

CHILD 3: Oh, do you think the angels left any tracks?

DORM MOM: Let's read some more and find out. (*Reads Luke 2:8-12*)

**SONG: "The First Noel"**

CHILD 4: Maybe the angels didn't leave tracks, but the shepherds came.

CHILD 1: Yes, the shepherds made lots of tracks when they came to see Jesus.

DORM MOM: The Bible says - (*Reads Luke 2:14-16*)

**SONG: "O Come All Ye Faithful" or "Silent Night"**
